# This is What **STRENGTH** Looks Like

**At Orchards Children's Services, our strength lies in our clients and their amazing triumphs. With the help of Orchards Children's Services social workers, we see our clients, both children and adults, pull themselves from difficult situations and write their own, happier story on a regular basis.**

Ken has been working with our ARC program for a few years. Forming a close bond with his case worker Annie, Ken was able to graduate high school and was accepted into college. Before starting his first semester he revealed his dream of moving out of Michigan to live with his mother's side of the family. While other agencies were previously unable to locate Ken's mother's family, Annie was successful. Ken's mother had escaped a domestic violence relationship and was living a happy and successful life. Through Ken's resilience and all of his hard work, he was able to stay in college and is well on his way of making his dream of living with his family come true.



Sharron's case was opened because of domestic violence. Sharron was placed on house arrest due to an incident involving her previous partner. This was her first CPS case and she was unfamiliar and very guarded while starting services. However, Orchards was able to engage her in a discussion about past experiences and her own personal goals for the future. Since completing services, Sharron is successfully off house arrest and all charges have been dropped. She is completing therapy and has maintained only safe relationships while building up her own self-esteem. She was able to evaluate previous traumas to increase her ability to maintain a healthy relationship with not only her next partner, but her children and her self as well. Through Sharron's strength, she was able to change her own situation to make life better for her and her family.



7 kids were found during a drug bust in a home. All were near death! Two of the boys had global developmental delays, and physical and emotional delays. They had never really gone to school. After making contact with Orchards, John and his little brother Adam were placed with an amazing and supportive foster family. After a failed adoption through another agency; the foster parents and Orchards allowed John and Adam

time to heal from the disruption. With Orchards and the foster parents rallied around them, giving them new experiences and working closely with Orchards mental health professionals; the boys were able to grow emotionally. After two years and multiple setbacks, the foster parents ultimately adopted Adam. Due to John's needs, he was placed in a residential facility. John is still supported by his foster family and gets to visit Adam frequently. John and Adam are in close contact with Orchards staff. Through John and Adam's determination and hard work, their future is bright.

# At Orchards...

## ADOPTION RESOURCE CONSULTANTS (ARC)

and Orchards Adoption Department have **ensured 111 children achieved permanence** through adoption and 2 permanencies through guardianship.



## ORCHARDS POST ADOPTION RESOURCE CENTERS (PARC)

served 96 families; resulting in **98% of adoptive families remaining intact** while engaged in services.

## ADOPTION RESOURCE CONSULTANTS (ARC)

served **168 children** who are eligible for adoption without prospective adoptive parents identified.



## GROUP-BASED PARENTAL EDUCATION PROGRAM



Since 2019, **189 parents have completed the 18 sessions - 92% showed an increase in understanding** and using nurturing parenting skills as a replacement for abusive parenting techniques.

## TRU (TRUST | RENEW | UNDERSTAND)

**2,467 hours of mental health services** have been provided to 364 individual clients - 98% of those referred have remained actively engaged in mental health services.



## FAMILY PRESERVATION

### FOSTER CARE

**42 children have been safely reunified** with their families of origin.



Over **5,000 children** engaged in Family Preservation services during the **fiscal year - 96% remained safely in the home** without experiencing a recurrence of abuse or neglect.
